#### Mission Update from Linda Holonia

As of January 1, I have taken on the responsibility of heading the Missions Committee. Due to my recent surgery and recuperation (which is ongoing), I have not been able to do anything yet. But that is about to change. If you are interested in being part of the Missions Committee, please contact me.

This month I want to give a short update regarding a few of the missions that we support:

- I have been in touch with Options for Her, formerly Options for Women. Several people have wondered why the name change. I asked if they were moving away from their Christian beginnings. The answer was a firm "No." They sent me a copy of their statement of faith, which is quite lengthy. It is posted on the bulletin board at the Graisbury Ave. entrance. The last point of their statement of faith says it all: "We believe that all human life is sacred and created by God in His image."
- Secondly, NJ Cru (Campus Crusade for Christ): We have supported a few different individuals or couples who have been local leaders in this organization, bringing the Gospel to college students across the state. Most recently we supported Alex and Joel Aponte. However, they have been transferred and now serve in Florida. Marc and Allysa Stasio have filled the vacancy left by the Aponte's. We now support the Stasio's as they work on college campuses across the state.
- Lastly, we have supported Dave & Kathy (MacCulloch) Mannon since the beginning of their ministry for ISI (International Students, Inc.) They served on Rutgers New Brunswick campus, ministering to international students attending college at Rutgers. Many of the students they ministered to became Christians and took their faith back to their home countries after their college careers were finished. However, David recently accepted a position in a secular field and the Mannons no longer serve at ISI. Therefore, our support of them has ended.

<u>A note of thanks:</u> My deepest thanks to you all for your prayers, meals and cards during my recent surgery and recovery. Thanks too, to Jane Gannon and Bethany Griffis for covering for me at the office. You have no idea how much all of your kindnesses have meant to me.

# **General Conference of the United Methodist Church** Will be held April 23-May 3 in Charlotte, N.C.

General Conference is the denomination's highest legislative body. As such, it has the authority to make revisions to the denomination's Book of Discipline and Book of Resolutions. Delegates to the General Conference elect members of the Judicial Council, the denomination's top court; members of the commission that plans General Conference; and some members of other denominational leadership bodies. The Book of Discipline states that any United Methodist organization, clergy member or lay member may submit a General Conference petition — basically the United Methodist equivalent of a bill before a legislature.

All told, the coming General Conference has received 1,099 total valid petitions — including 352 new petitions submitted since General Conference's delay in 2020.

The coming General Conference plans to have 862 voting delegates—half clergy and half lay.
