

#### **God's Answer to Loneliness**

People with physical disabilities have said that their greatest pain is loneliness. It is also felt by parents who have been neglected by their children, by husbands and wives who have lost their mate, and by people from a minority group who have been excluded from social activities

If we want to be followers of our Savior, we should be reaching out to the lonely all around us. But we can't be with them all the time, nor can we fully know their pain. Our presence may help but we are never enough. Only God can meet the needs of the lonely. And here is the good news. In Jesus he has revealed Himself as "Immanuel", which Means, "God With Us".

One day G. Campbell Morgan visited an elderly woman who lived alone. Before leaving he read, "Low I am with you always, even to the end of the age" (Matthew28:20). "A great promise". With a twinkle in her eye she retorted, "Dr. Morgan, that's not a promise. It's reality!" For her, Immanuel was the ultimate cure for loneliness. God said. "I will never leave you nor forsake you". (Hebrews 13:5)

Our Church Missions Linda Holonia

Kids Alley is one of the missions we have supported almost from its inception, 2024 saw a great impact on 50 families and 100 children in Camden City. Manna Academy empowers and equips 12-15 moms weekly with life skills, goal setting, resources and support. One of the adults in the Academy enrolled in college courses in 2024 to earn her BA. The children in grades K-8 received educational enrichment, mentorship, character development, recreational and educational field trips during the summer. Two of the learning center staff are former Kids Alley "kids," who wanted to give back. The children provided were with homework assistance and tutoring during the school year. Kids Alley provides fun, educational clubs filled with new experiences such as cooking, art, STEM, and team building. Saturday Live, their weekly program, almost tripled in 2024, empowering children, youth, and parents with God's love.

Looking ahead, they are pursuing targeted grants and other fundraising initiatives. A pro bono grant writer has already doubled their grant submissions. They plan to launch comprehensive marketing strategy and increase presence and media community recognition. They continue to host speaking engagements and networking events. The **Programming** and Spiritual Development Committee is ready to meet the needs with excellence.

### LENT

#### **Ash Wednesday**

\*\_It is immediately preceded by Shrove Tuesday. Ash Wednesday is a solemn reminder of human mortality and the need for reconciliation with God and marks the beginning of the penitential Lenten season. It is commonly observed with the distribution of ashes and with fasting.

\*Ash Wednesday marks the start of a 40-day period which is an allusion to the separation of

**Jesus in the desert to fast and pray**. During this time he was tempted. Matthew 4:1–11, Mark 1:12–13, and Luke 4:1–13.

\*Although the holiday of Ash Wednesday is **never directly mentioned in the Bible**, it is one of the most celebrated Christian events in church history. Ash Wednesday marks the beginning of Lent, a 40-day season of fasting, reflection, and remembrance before the Holy Week and the Resurrection of Jesus on Easter Sunday.

## VALENTINE'S DAY

While imprisoned, Valentine cared for his fellow prisoners and also his jailor's blind daughter. Legend has it that Valentine cured the girl's blindness and that his final act before being executed was to write her a love message signed 'from your Valentine'. Valentine was executed on 14 February in the year 270.

### PRESIDENT'S DAY

Presidents' Day, in the United States, holiday (third Monday in February) popularly recognized as honouring George Washington and Abraham Lincoln. The day is sometimes understood as a celebration of the birthdays and lives of all U.S. presidents.



# GROUND HOG DAY, FEBRUARY 2

It derives from the Pennsylvania Dutch superstition that if a groundhog emerges from its burrow on this day and sees its shadow, it will retreat to its den and winter will go on for six more weeks; if it does not see its shadow, spring will arrive early.
